Lower Platte North NRD Seeks Public Input on Groundwater Management

The Lower Platte North Natural Resources District (LPNNRD) is currently updating its Groundwater Management Plan and is seeking input from the public. The primary goal is to meet standards for an approved plan while providing a tool for the LPNNRD to make informed decisions for the long-term management of groundwater quality and quantity. This is a valuable opportunity for community members, property owners, and agricultural producers to voice their opinions and contribute to the sustainable management of our groundwater resources.

During the plan update, the LPNNNRD is examining procedures to determine the level of management needed for water quality, particularly focusing on nitrates, and is reviewing wells used to monitoring groundwater levels. The LPNNRD is also considering the establishment of subareas defined by hydrogeology for future groundwater management. These topics will be discussed at two Open House meetings.

The meetings are scheduled for:

- Monday, August 26th, from 6:00 to 7:00 PM at the Platte Center Auditorium
- Tuesday, August 27th, from 6:00 to 7:00 PM at the Clint Johannes Education Building east of Lake Wanahoo in Wahoo
